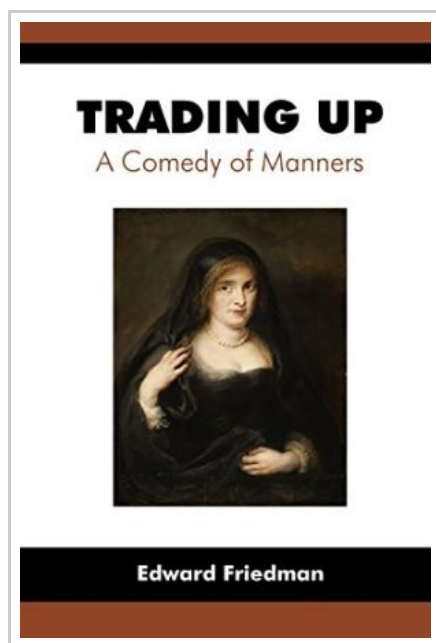




## Trading Up: A Comedy of Manners (Paperback)

The handsome, wealthy, and noble Don Diego has been courting the lovely widow Dona Carmen for two years. When Dona Carmen s niece Dona Elena comes to Madrid for a visit, Don Diego sets his sights on the new arrival-a bit younger, a bit richer, and a bit more beautiful than her aunt-in an attempt to trade up. He enlists the aid of a friend to serve as a distraction. Meanwhile, Dona Carmen s cousin, a marquis, also takes an interest in Dona Elena, and his shy chief of staff is smitten with Dona Carmen. The resulting courtship rituals become ever more complex, and three clever and goodhearted servants supply a running commentary.
